SEASON OF ADVENT



Dear Monican Community,

We enter the Season of Advent as we await the coming of Christmas and the commemoration of the birth of Jesus, God and man. Jesus was born in very humble circumstances to Blessed Mary who conceived Him through the intercession of God. This was the birth of a new king, a King of Peace, and Saviour of the world from the power and might of evil.

I wish all Monicans a very happy Christmas in this year that has been so difficult to bear for so many. The pain and anguish pervade our thoughts still, whilst millions of people in other countries are experiencing the virus spread and its effects in large numbers now.

Free TAFE courses!



<u>Free TAFE for priority courses</u> gives more Victorians the chance to study at TAFE.

More than ever, the skills we need to build our state are learnt at TAFE.

Free TAFE for priority courses reduces financial barriers for students. Students can train in courses that lead to jobs in demand from Victorian employers.

Free TAFE for priority courses began on 1 January 2019. At the end of its first year more than 39,700 students had commenced in Free TAFE courses across the TAFE network.

In January 2020, two new early childhood courses were added to the Free TAFE course list. From Semester Two 2020, four new Free TAFE courses are being added in priority areas with in-demand jobs. The additional Free TAFE places are being provided to support individuals affected by coronavirus (COVID -19).

Free TAFE for priority courses covers tuition fees for students who are eligible for government-subsidised training.
