### **COLLEGE THEME, 2021**

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2021 \$225.00

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors: **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, veteran's affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students \$225 for secondary school students.

#### Accepting applications

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases.

Parents only need to submit an application form in 2021 if any of these changes have occurred.

- New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2021 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2020
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2021.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (27 January 2021) or term two (19 April 2021).

#### **Closing Date**

#### **DALTON ROAD CAMPUS SAFETY GUIDELINES**

- Construction sites are securely fenced off
- Additional yard duties have been added to our recess and lunchtime rosters
- Two staff members are on morning and afternoon gate duty ensuring student safety
- Year 9 students exit the campus via Gate 4, whilst Year 7 and 8 students exit the campus via Gate 3 avoiding congestion
- Each year level has been designated an active and passive play area away from the construction sites
- Students have been instructed to avoid the construction sites
- The Augustine House carpark has been closed and gated and is used only by builders
- Construction works are assessed daily between the College, Architects and Builders
- Soundproofing and extra hoardings are installed as required.



#### Why secondary schools?

- School hours fall within peak UV periods of the day
- Exposure to UV in adolescence contributes to skin cancer risk in later life
- Melanoma is the most common cancer in Australian adolescents aged 15–29 years.

#### Protect your skin

Ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun is the main cause of skin cancer. Fortunately, most skin cancer can be prevented by using good sun protection when the UV is above 3.

Slip! Slop! Slap! Seek! Slide! during sun protection times.

It's never too late to improve your sun protection habits, whether you're six months or 60 years old.

#### Slip on clothing

Clothing can be a great barrier between the sun's UV and your skin.

#### Slop on sunscreen

Sunscreen should be considered the last line of defence. No sunscreen blocks 100% of UV radiation.

#### Slap on a hat


Look for a hat with a tight weave and broad brim that provides good shade to your face, head, neck and ears


Look out for the reduced speed limit around schools and slow down to improve safety.

#### School crossings




- Look out for flags and Crossing Supervisors

- Please remain stopped until the crossing is clear.

#### Within 10 metres of an intersection




A driver must not stop with any part of their vehicle within 10 metres of an intersection unless signed otherwise.

#### Yellow edge line




A driver must not stop on the side of a road marked with a yellow edge line.

# No parking on nature strips/footpaths



Parking is illegal on nature strips and footpaths.

#### Stopping across driveways



It is illegal to, stop/park across a driveway unless you stay in the car are there for no more than two minutes and move immediately if required to do so to allow entry or exit by the owner/occupier.

#### Parking/Stopping signage









No stopping areas must be kept clear. If times/days are specified, restrictions are only applicable to the specified times/days. You cannot park in a P3 minute area for longer than three minutes.

#### Double parking



It is illegal to double park at any time. This affects the flow of traffic.

#### 3 metre gap for signage



At least 3 metres must be left between your vehicle and the centre dividing line to allow other vehicles to pass safely and not obstruct traffic.

#### What can you do to stay safe

- Supervise your children in or near traffic
- Walk or cycle to school with your child
- Respect all road rules, parking signs and instructions from authorities
- Wait on the same side of the street as your child
- Always let your child out of the kerb side of the car.
