Mothers brought us into the world, cared and nurtured us in our first years, and journeyed with us through early childhood until whatever age we are today. Mothers deserve our greatest and most grateful and loving thanks. God bless them all. We pray for mothers who are deceased and those who are separated from us for whatever reason.

Jesus knew His mother loved Him deeply. It was Mary who knelt at the foot of the cross, her son crucified for our salvation. Mary is a most significant person in the Bible from the Annunciation when she was asked to be the mother of the Saviour right through to the death of Jesus on that cross. The Church teaches infallibly that Mary was assumed body and soul into Heaven after the resurrection of her son.

Augustine knew that his mother loved him. It was Monica who left her country, family and lifestyle to literally pursue Augustine through Europe until finally she joined him in Milan and her prayers converted Augustine to the faith in Jesus Christ. Through these dark and long days, in association with Bishop

Ambrose, and with enormous perseverance, Monica was the perfect and devoted mother. How wonderful for this saintly woman that Augustine travelled physically and spiritually with her until the time she entered eternal life at Ostia.



Mothers come in all forms and Mums change through the decades, as they grow older. The young and vibrant Mum becomes the sometimes anxious mother of the teenager, the proud mother of the bride or groom, loving grandma, and mothers grow old in

different circumstances.

Mothers can be the sole parent for a variety of reasons – all personal. We often read about the single mum caring for her children, the abandoned mum left with the responsibility to raise her family singlehandedly, mums who are ill, mothers who find the emotional challenges of life sometimes very difficult to bear. We love them all.

Mothers are wives, child bearers and carers, grandmothers; some are stepmothers whilst others are aunts who love their family members as if each child was her own. Let us hope that Monicans never take their mother for granted and expect from them that which mothers ought not to be asked to give. Be kind and loving to your mothers, Monicans.




INDIGENOUS AWARENESS WEEK

ONLINE FEES PAYMENT ON COMMUNITY PORTAL – BREAKING NEWS!!!!!!!!

The College is pleased to advise that online fees payment is now available on the St Monica's College Synergetic Community Portal. Just log in and click on the 'Finance' tab. As well as seeing your invoices, there is now the option to make payments. The default payment shows your total current balance; however, you can overwrite this amount and choose the amount you wish to pay. Once payment is made you will receive a receipt by email. As well, you will also be able to view all receipts of payments made in the past. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND 2019 \$225

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, Veterans Affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students \$225 for secondary school students.

How to Apply

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Accepting applications

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases.

Parents only need to submit an application form in 2019 if any of these changes have occurred.

- New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2019 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2019
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January, 2019) or term two (23 April, 2019).

Closing Date:

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY GUIDELINES



A new 24 hour movement guideline was recently launched. Key recommendations from the guidelines for 5-17 year olds included:

- Sixty minutes or more of moderate to vigorous physical activity per day
- Limiting sedentary recreational screen time to no more than 2 hours per day
- Nine to 11 hours of uninterrupted sleep per night for children aged between 5 to 13 and 8 to 10 hours per night for those aged between 14 and 17.
