# YOU DESERVE A MEDAL

Medals are awarded frequently to acclaim the achievements of a person. Medals are prestigious items, and who would not value highly an Olympic Games Medal or a Medal for Meritorious Service to one's nation?

In 1991, the College Board of St Monica's College introduced College Medals under three categories. These are: St Monica's Medal (student, past or present); Polding Medal (past or present staff member or chaplain); and Samaritan Medal (past or present parent, friend or benefactor). A complete list of medal recipients appears on page 10 in the 2020 Student Planner.

Last year, the St Monica's Medal was presented to 2018 College Captain, Ms Primrose Gwitima. Primrose gracefully accepted the Medal at the Term 1 Assembly and her words would have inspired hundreds of Monicans gathered in the Hall that morning. On Friday, 13 December 2019, the Polding Medal was presented to Miss Paula Di Maria, our Deputy Principal and DSC Campus Director. Paula's words of thanks and appreciation were moving and very well expressed. On Thursday 20 February this year, I had the honor to present Mr Mario Bernardi, College Board Chairperson, with his second Commemorative Medal, the Samaritan Medal. Mario was awarded the St Monica's Medal in 2004.

Each of last year's recipients was truly pleased and quite overcome emotionally to receive a College Medal. Each is a distinguished Old Collegian of this great school. The College Board is of the opinion that it is appropriate and a pleasure to recognise the contributions and service of Monicans in ways such as a College Medal.

#### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2020 \$225

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, veterans affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students

\$225 for secondary school students.

#### How to Apply:

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from <u>www.education.vic.gov.au/csef</u>

#### Accepting applications:

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases.

Parents only need to submit an application form in 2020 if any of these changes have occurred.

- New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2020 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2019.
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

#### **Eligibility Date:**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January, 2020) or term two (14 April, 2020).

#### **Closing Date:**

You should lodge a CSEF application form at the school by 26 June, 2020 for eligibility . For more information about the CSEF visit <u>www.educationvic.gov.au/csef</u>

#### MARVELLOUS MONICAN


