GIFTS on the TABLE COLLEGE THEME, 2020

People daily assemble at a table, splendid banquet tables laden with rich food, homely tables that gather

the family members, executive tables where major decisions are taken, and small desks in classrooms around the world. At St Monica's College, Epping in 2020, a Year of Jubilee, we shall together and individually be invited to give and receive an array of gifts on the Monican table that provides for our community. Our College Theme in 2020 is 'Gifts on the Table'.

This year Monicans will be invited to decorate, replenish and share their gifts as placed on the table of our College. We shall be assured that each of us is a loved and treasured Child of God, a gift to our parents and families and to each other. Our own giftedness will be celebrated and acclaimed as we place emphasis on our Monican culture of effective teaching and learning.

Gifts given freely, gifts created through sacrifice and hard effort, gifts large and imposing, and small and fragile. We shall meet gift-givers throughout the year, people whose life reflects service to the poor, those marginalized, the sick and imprisoned, the homeless and the stateless refugee. We shall have many gifts placed on our table – gifts that inspire us, motivate us, energize us, influence our beliefs and actions, and gifts that simply delight us and create for us a happy school community.

We shall learn and discuss the special Gifts of the Holy Spirit — Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord. This Year of Jubilee will be enriched as these wondrous gifts are placed on our table, unwrapped and revealed, and their goodness spreads through the corridors of SMC. On each day of the school year, we shall pass by and encounter the Monican Tables of Life, a table placed on each Campus in a prominent position awaiting the gifts or messages or prayer requests that Monicans place upon them. They themselves will be gifts, beautiful furniture crafted by human hands and decorated with care.

The Table of the Lord will lead us to beautiful and holy liturgies as we gather for Eucharist. Jesus at table blessed the bread and wine and gave to us the most special gift of all, His own body and blood. Our gifts will be those we place on the table as a community. They will be gifts of service, compassion, rich in justice and overflowing with authentic generosity. As Monicans, we shall reach out from our table and welcome people from all places to join us. Monicans will belong to a community that shows hospitality to the guest and the stranger equally and with pleasure. We will be reminded how Christ can often be

met through the gift of hospitality given at our table.

Our gifts will be those we place on the table individually. These will be acts of kindness Monicans do for others, their smiles of joy, and their gentle hand of friendship. These individual gifts will be personal and signs of a relationship with Jesus. From our table, practical gifts will be sent to foreign missions both in Australia and throughout the world in places such as Pakistan and the Philippines. Many gifts will be hand crafted by Monicans. There will be wholesome food for all, sufficient drink to satisfy the greatest thirst, a table laid out in the blue and gold cloth of Monican heritage. We shall prepare ourselves to come and place our gifts on the table by taking Jesus in the Gospel as our guide. Jesus, with the apostles before and after His death and resurrection; Jesus, with Martha and Mary demonstrating the gift of friendship; Jesus, with the despised Pharisees and tax collectors, eating and speaking with them and demonstrating the gift of forgiveness; Jesus who beckoned Zacchaeus down from the tree and joined this unpopular man for a meal.

Throughout this Jubilee Year, Monicans will gather around many tables but always with one purpose — to pray and persevere. Tables will be the desks at which we learn and use and develop the gifts of knowledge we possess; table benches at lunchtimes when Monicans talk, laugh and relax with each other; staffroom tables for recreation and planning; the grand table of the Board Room at which the best use of our gifts will be determined by leaders. At Mass, we shall gather before the altar, the Table of the Lord.

Monican gifts will appear in many forms. There will be gifts of knowledge provided, shared and learned, gifts of talent and skill as presented through achievements in concert bands, on sporting fields, at debating competitions and chess and eSports tournaments. Our gifts will be community service, immersion into other communities, charity, sacrifices made, beauty created, Monican life lived in a spirit of good will and acceptance of all people.

In 2020, each Monican will be encouraged and supported personally to be a gift that makes this school community comfortable, rich in mercy and love; to come to our table and sit in partnership with each other, enjoying and giving thanks for the experience of being Monican; to use the Campus tables as focal points for reflection on our giftedness and needs; and, on the table, to contribute gifts given freely and receive gifts given with grace and gratitude.

In 2020, we are all invited to come to the table.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2020 \$225.00

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, Veteran's Affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students

\$225 for secondary school students.

How to Apply

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Accepting applications

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases. Parents only need to submit an application form in 2019 if any of these changes have occurred.

- New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2020 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2019
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either Term 1 (28 January, 2020) or Term 2 (14 April, 2020).

Closing Date

You should lodge a CSEF application form at the school by 26 June, 2020 for eligibility. For more information regarding the CSEF, visit www.educationvic.gov.au/csef






