Dear Parents,

On Thursday, 3 February 2022 the College provided each student with a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kit to take home. Please ensure your child has given it to you.



Our three careers practitioners, Mr White, Mrs Maloney, and Mr Stehn, along with our administrative assistant, Mrs Martin look forward to meeting with many of our students in 2022 to assist in all their career development needs.

Year 12 students have already been informed of the upcoming Goal Setting meetings. Each student will have a brief meeting with a staff member to discuss their goals for 2023 and what this means for their studies in 2022. There will be an opportunity during these meetings to make a careers appointment for a more extensive meeting (and follow up meetings if necessary), to assist in developing a career pathway.

Work has already begun with the Year 10 pre-VCAL students as part of their Employment Pathways course to prepare them for their 2 compulsory Work Experience placements this year. All other Year 10 students are encouraged to also do Work Experience and should make a careers appointment to discuss the possibilities.

Whilst Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is undertaken by most senior school VCAL students, all VCE VET students are also strongly encouraged to do SWL as part of their VET course. For VCE students it is a little more difficult to organise, but they are still strongly encouraged to make a careers appointment to discuss their options.

We also look forward to working with all other year levels as we introduce career education into their curriculum as well as some standalone careers lessons.

Our first edition of the Careers Newsletter will be in the inbox of all students and their parents on 14 February. Those who access the Newsletter on a regular basis know how informative it is and the excellent resources that it provides to assist with career exploration.

BPAY, Eftpos, Credit Card-Visa/Mastercard, Cash/ Cheques/Community (fee) portal online payments and Direct Debit.

Financial assistance for Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) 2022 \$225.00

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, veterans affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students

\$225 for secondary school students.

How to Apply

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Accepting applications

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases.

Parents only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of these changes have occurred.

 New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2022 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2021.

Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January, 2022) or term two

(26 April, 2022).

Closing Date

You should lodge a CSEF application form at the school by 24 June, 2022 for eligibility. For more information about the CSEF visit www.educationvic.gov.au/csef

NEW STRUCTURE

Areas of the Wellbeing Liaison Role

In 2021, a decision was taken to appoint Wellbeing Liaisons at both campuses in direct response to a working party's recommendations to support counselling and wellbeing services at the College, from 2022. We are very excited to announce the details below which outline these significant Staff roles that have been created to support both students and staff, following 2 years of disrupted schooling due to the global pandemic. Parents, Staff and Students are asked to refer any queries or questions to Ms Sylvia Pasahidis (DSC) and Ms Monica Maroulakos (DRC) or Mrs Deborah O'Malley (Senior Teacher Wellbeing and Counselling Services).

We look forward to working with this new structure. These new Wellbeing Liaisons, together with our Counsellors, Wellbeing Staff, external agencies and of course our Homeroom teachers and Year Level Leaders are all well equipped to support our students. After all, our care and responsibility to our students is at our central core and we are ready to embrace a new model, not leaving one child behind.

Wellbeing Liaison - 2022

What is the role?

- → The Wellbeing Liaison is a member of the Wellbeing and Counselling Services Team and liaises between the Counselling Team and Staff of St Monica's College, Epping.
- ★ The focus of this role is to support Wellbeing in the SMC community and to enhance the work of our Counselling Team

Each campus has a Wellbeing Liaison:

- DRC Monica Maroulakos
 - DSC Sylvia Pasahidis

1. WELLBEING

Wellbeing Liaison duties summary for this area:

- assist in identifying and supporting students who are facing new and/or increased challenges as a result of the impact of COVID-19
- coordinate small group peer support sessions, work to improve social skills, resilience building, one on one sessions if required
- investigate the introduction of a Peer Support program (staff and/or student programs)
- work with staff to address student wellbeing needs which impact and /or stem from student academic performance
- act as a conduit between teaching staff and the Counselling Team to provide staff with strategies, activities and sessions to support student wellbeing and to address mental health concerns in the classroom.

How can the Wellbeing Liaison and Teachers work together within the 'Wellbeing and Counselling Services' area?

- coordinate small workshops for groups of students requiring support (teachers may suggest students)
- work with Year Level Leaders, Teachers and Counsellors on more complex wellbeing cases, assisting with management and follow up, communication with teachers, classroom visits, etc.
- Wellbeing Liaison may engage appropriate staff to parttake in a Peer Support program
- Wellbeing Liaison may visit classes and suggest student specific strategies to support identified students.

2 PROGRAMS

Wellbeing Liaison duties summary for this area:

- assist in enhancing and evaluating the Years 7 10 Pastoral Curriculum
- embed and promote the PEEC program across the College
- assist with the promotion of Wellbeing programs and initiatives.

How can the Wellbeing Liaison and Teachers work together within the 'Programs' area?

- visit PEEC Pastoral lessons
- conduct student and/or staff reviews of the PEEC program
- support and assist in the implementation of the PEEC program
- Wellbeing Liaison may offer or suggest some Positive

3. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Wellbeing Liaison duties summary for this area:

- work on the development of Professional Learning opportunities for staff in the area of Wellbeing and Counselling Services
- assist in the planning and facilitation of the Staff Development – Wellbeing Sessions in collaboration with Wellbeing and Counselling Services
- distribute relevant information to Year Level Teams and Faculty Teams
- meet with Staff to provide strategies to manage and support students who require wellbeing support
- organise and facilitate Professional Learning opportunities for staff which empower them to respond to student wellbeing needs

How can the Wellbeing Liaison and Teachers work together within the 'Professional Development' area?

 Wellbeing Liaison will source and suggest appropriate PD to staff members who may require additional skill building to support specific students.

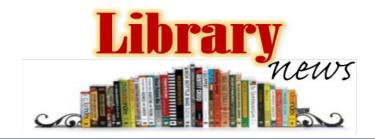
4. COMMUNITY

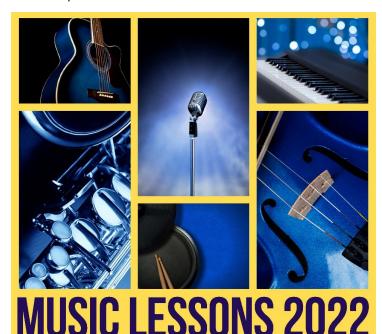
Instrumental Music Enrolment
