Taking matters in your stride

Not always and not everything goes as we would want it. Life throws up challenges, some of which are welcomed and embraced: others are unexpected and undesirable. This seems to happen to everyone, including Monicans.

We could state that COVID needs to be 'taken in our stride' though this would be somewhat flippant. It is more serious as are other instances that involve bereavement, ill health, and tragedies. These matters demand of us calmness, thought, and appropriate actions according to the situation.

What we should take in our stride is doing things we would prefer not to do. In our Monican context as a school, this includes (for some) undertaking homework and study; wearing our uniform properly and with all the correct items; ensuring we meet grooming regulations; using acceptable language always; and respecting College property as we move around (including avoidance of littering).

Nothing expected of a Monican in his or her daily attendance at school is unreasonable. Rules and regulations are set for a purpose - the staged development of the students through adolescence. No standard of behaviour is stipulated to be cruel or unfair or harsh. Teachers expect the cooperation of students in this regard, and essentially too the support of parents who have made the decision to send their child to SMC.

Our College seeks to be a community where students can have a voice, and indeed we welcome this. There are student representatives elected by the students, student councils exist on both campuses, class captains are chosen by their peers, and most teachers will welcome respectful and sensile suggestions from their students on appropriate matters.


Taking matters in their stride invites students to mature and move from childhood to greater more responsible behaviour and reactions. This calls on the College to nurture students in discernment, critical analysis of arguments, reasoned thinking, and broadmindedness that considers and develops options for most situations. Simply being critical, whingeing, complaining or even disobeying are not Monican values.

On certain matters, compliance and obedience are required. This involves safety and order in the school environment. On other matters, discussion is welcome, ideas are heard and possibly acted upon, alternatives are considered. Simply resisting, spreading disharmony, or even refusing to cooperate on core principles are not Monican values.

Striding is a forward action, a most preferred manner of acting and behaving as we travel together on our journeys ahead.

SCHOOL CAMPS and EXCURSIONS

In line with current government guidelines, excursions can continue to operate. A risk assessment will be performed before each one is approved and parents will be informed of the COVID safe measures being taken. Those excursions crucial to the delivery of school curriculum will be given priority.

The College has made the decision to limit overnight Camps for 2022, therefore Year 8 Stepping Stones, Uniquely Year 9 and Year 10 On the Edge will all run in a different format for 2022. Parents will be informed of the dates and structure of these programs shortly.

CAR PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

Car parking at Dalton Road is for staff only. Staff can park at the front car park alongside the soccer pitch and between the athletics track and soccer pitch. Please adhere to speed limits and parking signals. Drop off is available along Dalton Road before and after school. All City of Whittlesea car parking restrictions apply during peak times.

At Davisson Street car parking is for staff only with the pick up and drop off available for parents. This is accessible before and after school and also when students have free study periods. Can parents please take care and not block entrance or exits or drive in the wrong direction. Speed limits of 5km an hour apply in this car park also.



MAKING AN APPOINTMENT

Many students can find thinking about their future overwhelming, but we are here to help!

Students in Years 10 to 12 can make a Careers Appointment to see a Careers Practitioners for assistance in clarifying study pathways, help with researching potential careers, advice on potential subject changes and much more.

Students in Year 7-9 can make a booking by seeing their Year Level Leaders.

YEAR 9 CAREER CLASSES DURING PASTORAL LESSONS

Career Management has been a hot topic during Year 9 Pastoral lessons this week. Students have been introduced to the Career Website and shown its many advantages and powerful resources that can be used right up until the end of Year 12.

During their first lesson, students were able to complete a *Modern Careers* quiz and explore job information which may be of interest to them. This quiz assists students to reflect on themselves and to explore a range of options that exist in the dynamic world of work.

YEAR 12 GOAL SETTING SESSIONS

Year 12 Goal Setting interviews have commenced with many students taking the opportunity to meet staff to briefly discuss their aims beyond Year 12.

These interviews have been a great way for students to seek advice about future courses and pathways. Many students have also used these sessions to make additional appointments for further discussions regarding their future.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2022 \$225.00

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camps** provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, veterans' affairs or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

\$125 for primary school students \$225 for secondary school students.

How to Apply

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Accepting applications

Parents (including guardians) no longer need to submit a new application form each year in most cases.

Parents only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of these changes have occurred.

- New student enrolments: students who have started or changed schools in 2022 or if the parent did not apply for CSEF at the school in 2021
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession

card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January, 2022) or term two (26 April 2022).

Closing Date

You should lodge a CSEF application form at the school by 24 June, 2022 for eligibility. For more information about the CSEF visit www.educationvic.gov.au/csef


